

Directions for the authors of the Hungarian Dermatological and Venereological Review

The goal of the Dermatological and Venereological Review is to make improvement in the area of dermato-venereology and cosmetology, to spread the methods of the discipline, to release the foreign and local results, to help the functional appropriation of the scientific results, to familiarize the Hungarian research results as wide as possible in Hungary, and abroad also, to enrich the scientific knowledge and improve the ethical views of Hungarian and international dermatologists.

We ask our authors to do as follows, to help the work of the editorial office and printing house.

The terms of publication are the follows:

- The article was not published before.
- The co-authors agree to publish the material in this form.
- The author needs to declare if the applied methods in researches those involving human subjects meet the requirements of Declaration of Helsinki (1975, revision: 2008) and have the permission of the institutional, regional or ETT committees.
- The author also has to declare that the author has the permission of the committee responsible for human examinations to publish their data.
- The author needs to declare which institutional or national regulations were used during the research involving animals.
- The author needs to enclose conflict of interest statement, statement according to the animal researches if any, and allowance statement from the patients about publishing photographs.

The editorial office is entitled to consider and accept the manuscripts, and the manuscripts must get over a peer review process.

First page must contain the follows:

- title of manuscript in Hungarian (short, according to the content),
- title of manuscript in English,
- authors' names, with indexes referring to the institute, they are working in,
- correspondent author's name, institute, address, and e-mail address

- manuscripts should be signed by the leader of the institute
- Hungarian summary,
- keywords in Hungarian (max. 4-6)

Second page must contain the follows:

- English summary,
- keywords in English (max. 4-6)

Keywords has to be given according to MeSH (Medical Subject Headings) dictionary.

The summaries have to be written in third person plural, and contain the goals, experimental data, survey data, result and short discussion of the manuscript as a resume.

The summaries have to be between 600 and 750 characters.

From the third page the manuscript must contain the following:

- text of the manuscript

Technical information:

- paper size: A4
- single page printing
- double row spacing
- continuously numbered pages
- 60-80 characters / row
- 28-30 rows / page
- size of manuscripts: 10-22 pages

The author needs to use the usual proportion. The PRELIMINARY chapter exposes the subject of the manuscript, in the MATERIAL AND METHODS chapter the used methods are particularized as far as the research will be repeatable, the RESULTS chapter exposes the important data and information, DISCUSSION chapter is needed in case of results to be discussed, important results are listed in the RESULTS paragraph. The ACKNOWLEDGEMENT chapter is between the text of the manuscript and the BIBLIOGRAPHY.

The BIBLIOGRAPHY starts on new page with continuous page numbers, as the examples expose: (authors' names, title of article referred, international short version of title of journal - National Library of Medicine's Title Abbreviation/NLM catalogue - <http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/nlmcatalog/> - year of publication, issue, page numbers - from, until - , if more than 3 authors sign the article, then after the name of the third author, „et al.” prefix should be used.

Table charts, and photographs should start on new page, implicitly signed. List of titles should be made referring to the signed charts and photographs. Titles should be short and precise. Place of charts and photographs should be marked in the text. In case of digital sending, large resolution is required in consideration of the printing technologies and internet publication.

Table charts and photographs are reviewed by members of editorial board before sending them to a proof-reader. Photographs of patients are allowed to be published only with allowance statement, which has to be posted to the office. To keep the patients anonymity, eyes should be covered on the photographs, and authors should avoid using monograms in the text.

Previously published pictures are allowed to be published again with the permission of the author and publisher, marking the source of the photographs. It is highly suggested to avoid the culminating use of foreign words. When first writing, short forms should be given in brackets. Short forms are not allowed in the title and in the summary.

The use of Medical Spelling Dictionary is suggested for correct spelling.

Manuscripts should be sent to the editorial office by e-mail, or on paper with the digital material on CD.
